Brexit: the October negotiations. House of Commons Library.

The fifth round of Brexit negotiations ran from 9 to 12 October. Some progress was made in the areas of citizens' rights and the Irish border, but not on the 'divorce bill'. The Secretary of State for Exiting the EU, David Davis, maintains that many issues can only be discussed in the context of the UK's future relations with the EU.

A new publication from the Universities of East Anglia (UEA) and Surrey that looks at how national governments and EU institutions are approaching Brexit negotiations was launched on Friday 20 October, at an event held at the British Academy in London.

325% rise in veterinary certifications needed for trade post-Brexit. Source BVA.

When the UK leaves the EU it may no longer enjoy the same trading freedom with EU countries and could be treated as a 'third country' by the EU. As such, exports and imports of animals and animal products to and from the EU will need new veterinary certifications. These will need to be developed and supervised, which will require an increase in the number of 'Official Veterinarians' to perform this role.

According to the UK Chief Veterinary Officer, Nigel Gibbens, the volume of products requiring veterinary certifications could increase by as much as 325%.

The CBI has analysed two types of barriers that UK companies would face if negotiators fail to secure to a

deal: tariffs on goods trade, and non-tariff barriers which make trade in both goods and services more complicated and costly. Without a deal, businesses will face both tariff and non-tariff barriers – and some industries will face greater challenges than others.
