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

East Coast Fisheries Liaison - Update

As a result of discussions at previous East Coast Dredging/Fisheries Liaison Committee meetings, a decision was taken to trial some alternative arrangements from June 2012 onwards.

These would see a single annual liaison committee meeting taking place during the summer (June/July), with the traditional winter meeting replaced by a written Issues Update which would be circulated electronically. The production of the Issues Update and its circulation would be coordinated by the British Marine Aggregate Producers Association.

The thinking behind this change was that the lines of communication and contacts were now sufficiently well developed to allow any site specific liaison issues to be addressed on a bi-lateral basis between the parties concerned. As a consequence, the committee had evolved towards a platform to report updated general information against standing agenda items. Rather than holding a winter meeting for this purpose, it was agreed that these updates could potentially be achieved equally well via a written report.

Following discussions at the liaison committee meeting which took place on the 24th June 2014, it was agreed to continue with this approach.

The third of these Issues Updates is now available, together with a separate document provided by MMO which provides an update on the status of all licences and applications in the Eastern region.

The usefulness and effectiveness of this approach will continue to be reviewed at formal meetings of the liaison committee, the next of which will be arranged to take place at a suitable East coast venue in June/July 2015. Details of the venue and timing will be circulated 8 weeks prior to the meeting date.

The marine aggregate industry remain committed to maintaining the levels of liaison and engagement with the commercial fishing sector. Therefore if any issues arise outside of the established liaison committee meeting cycle that are unable to be resolved through bi-lateral discussions, there is the option to arrange issue-specific meetings to address these.

Equally, if there are any comments on the information provided in the Issues Review, or suggestions for other information that could usefully be included, these should be sent to bmapa@mineralproducts.org so they can be considered at the summer liaison meeting.

Active Dredge Charts

Regional Active Dredge Area Charts - Issue 25 now available

Regional Active Dredge Area (RADA) charts are routinely produced by the British Marine Aggregate Producers Association (BMAPA) and The Crown Estate on a bi-annual basis (charts are dated 31st January and 31st July) to show where dredging operations are currently permitted within existing marine aggregate production licences.

Areas where dredging is permitted are monitored through the approved 'black box' Electronic Monitoring System (EMS) that is required to be installed on every marine aggregate dredger operating in UK waters.

Issue 25 of these charts (dated 31st January 2015) is now available to be downloaded from <u>http://www.bmapa.org/issues/other_sea_users.php</u>. The need for working areas within production licences can be defined through existing licence conditions or through individual marine aggregate operators' voluntary management arrangements.

Any changes in licence area or active zone from the previous issue (dated 31st July 2014) will be highlighted in red.
