For generations, white fishmongers' vans have left Northern Ireland's fishing ports laden with top-quality local seafood to serve customers in county markets and through door-to-door sales on 'patches', established over years and passed down through families.

Many mobile fishmongers do not advertise and rely on word of mouth to drive sales and attract customers. Details of some of the bigger operators and the local markets they attend can be found below. If you would like fish delivered to your home, mongers specialising in door-to-door sales operate around Northern Ireland - contact your local market fishmonger and he may be able to recommend a supplier.
