
- ✓ Open membership for all seafood producers in Northern Ireland
- ✓ ARG enables two-way communication between the NI aquaculture sector, DAERA and other agencies or groups.
- ✓ Responds to consultations & enquiries on behalf of the NI aquaculture sector
- ✓ Supports members in addressing issues arising.
- ✓ Commissions research to benefit the sector, e.g. carbon footprint assessment

Northern Ireland Aquaculture (2021)

✓ Around 25 businesses: all are SMEs, most are micro-enterpr

✓ Employs 143 people (104 FT, 39 PT 130 M, 13 F)

- Finfish: 1,142 tonnes worth £7.3 million.
- √ 36 licensed sites (25 active)
- ✓ Export of ova important (thanks to NI's disease-free status).
- Shellfish: 2,696 tonnes (half mussel, most bottom, and half oyster)
- ✓ worth £4.7 million
- ✓ (¾ oyster, ¼ mussel)
- ✓ 54 licensed sites (19 active)
- Seaweed: one farmer, DAERA/AFBI exploring how to expand sector.





Current Issues

• All: licensing and water quality

• Trout: Abstraction, Energy costs,

Blue-Green Algae, invasive species (zebra mussel)

• Mussel: seed supply (move to spat collection)

• Oyster: new licenses
