## 2020\* Import and export summary introduction




- This factsheet contains key facts relating to the UK's overall imports and exports of seafood
- The UK's total seafood trade decreased in 2020 in terms of value and volume, and the average £/kg fell
- Both seafood imports and exports decreased in value and volume, whilst experiencing deflation
- Imports' share of value trade increased to 67%, whilst it maintained 62% share of volume trade



### UK's seafood imports in 2020\*



- Seafood imports decreased in value and volume, whilst experiencing deflation
- The countries that import the largest value of seafood into the UK were Iceland, China, and Vietnam
- The value and volume of demersal, shellfish, and pelagic imports decreased. Whilst the average £/kg for demersal fell, it increased for shellfish and pelagic fish
- The species with the greatest import value were salmon, cod, and tuna








### UK's seafood exports in 2020\*



- Seafood exports decreased in value and volume, whilst experiencing deflation
- The UK exported the largest value of seafood to the following countries: France, U.S.A., and Spain
- The value and volume of shellfish and demersal exports fell, whilst pelagic exports increased. The average £/kg fell for all species groups
- The species with the greatest export value were salmon, mackerel, and nephrops
