Fish Exports

- The UK developed the Fish Export Service (FES) to provide validated catch certificates for UK fish.
- The UK will continue to engage with bilateral partners and multilateral organisations who require catch documents to make the exporting process as smooth as possible, minimising burdens
- Where possible and beneficial to UK industry, the UK will integrate or align the FES with other countries' schemes.

Fish Imports

- The catch certificate system is an important tool in tackling IUU fishing. It provides assurance that the fish being imported into the UK was caught legally and in-line with the relevant regulatory and management measures.
- For the purposes of the IUU regulation the flag state of the vessel is responsible for validating export catch certificates of its fleet.
- Importers must submit IUU documents to the relevant authority in advance of arrival to the IUU SLO or Port Health Authorities.

International cooperation

- We are implementing existing international agreements relating to IUU Fishing and encourage the strengthening of measures within international forums.
- We recognise the importance of cooperation through the sharing of information, best practice and expertise as well as working with international partners.

Carding & Listing

- The UK is in the process of developing its policy on the implementation of the identification of non-cooperating countries.
- As an independent coastal state, the listing process is an important tool for the UK to tackle IUU fishing. If a vessel is included on the UK's IUU vessel list, several restrictions will apply.
- The UK maintains an IUU Fishing vessel list that is aligned with all RFMOs, regardless of the UK's membership status.

Forced Labour

- The 2015 Modern Slavery Act gives law enforcement agencies, including the police and Border Force, the powers to investigate modern slavery offences at sea.
- Border Force is making effective use of the new maritime powers introduced by the Modern Slavery Act 2015 to detain vessels where there is suspected modern slavery.
- Border Force officers also undertake checks on seafarers arriving in the UK to join a vessel.

What is the SLO?

- The SLO is the **UK point of contact** for any matter relating to Illegal, Unreported or Unregulated (IUU fishing)

Legal basis



- The IUU Regulations (Council Regulation 1005/2008 and Article 39 of Commission Regulation Number 1010/2009) require that a Single Authority be established to undertake IUU Functions.
- This authority is known as the **Single Liaison Office (SLO)**.
- **Dialogue can be initiated between Flag State SLO's** when it appears that a catch certificate has been incorrectly validated or if the receiving flag state is unable to verify any particulars.

- A catch certificate is produced by exporters in order to **export fish** and validated by their flag state's competent authority. The catch certificate is forwarded to the country of import and is then **verified** by that country's authorities.
- A Catch Certificate provides an **audit trail** of all fishing activities and provides assurance that consignments have been sourced in a responsible way by actors who are authorised to do so.

What We Do in MMO IUU

Imports

- Verification of Import Catch Certificates
- Port Health Authority enquiries, verification requests, training, general support enquiries
- RFMO compliance & reporting requirements
- SPOC for all matters pertaining to IUU with 3rd countries
- Cross Govt. IUU Global info summary



Exports

- Fish Export Service (FES) – Export Catch Certificates for fish products which fall under scope of EU's IUU regulation
- SPOC for third countries wishing to verify UK catch certificates



Direct Landings

- Competent authority for direct landings of English vessels into third country NEAFC designated ports
- Competent authority for third country vessels landing into NEAFC designated English ports
- Authorisation/verification of associated documents (PSC1, PSC2, CCs, PLDs and assisting coastal officers in event of inspections)
