

Responsibility Under Legislation

- Merchant Shipping Act 1995: "the general lighthouse authorities shall have superintendence and management of all lighthouse, buoys and beacons within their areas"
- Marine (Scotland) Act 2010: Statutory Consultee for all Marine Licence applications- Safety of Navigation Consent.
- Responsible for ensuring every aquaculture site in Scotland does not pose a hazard to navigation.
- Active industry presence-promote better working relationships between regulators and producersguidance/information/support.

Origins of the AquaSHAD

- HSE Committee of the North (SASG):
 HSE, MCA, NLB, CES, Producers.
- Growing concern about the number of fatalities and injuries occurring.
- Agriculture Initiative
- Way Ahead Group: Regulators and Producers
- Positive, industry lead partnership of analysing accidents to reduce risk:
 - Promote better H&S
 - Increase risk awareness
 - - Information Sharing
 - Up to date training



The Way Ahead Group

- SASG subsidiary group- NLB (Chair), HSE, MCA, CES, RNLI, Industry H&S Managers
- Independent open framework for discussions between regulators and industry
- Real time information on industry issues/risks/incidents
- Plan, organise and co-ordinate annual AquaSHAD

The Event Itself

- Annual event, designed to bring delegates from all sectors of the aquaculture industry together and provide them with up to date training to reduce risk and improve their safety at work.
- Promote intercompany communication and forge stronger relationships between the industry and regulators.
- Circulates each year throughout Scotland- West Cost, Highland, Outer Hebrides, Orkney, Shetland.
- Industry driven training delivered by qualified instructors
- Funded by WAG members with additional support from SSPO

Structure

- 3 plenary scenarios + 6 group stances
- Delegates divided into groups undertake a round robin of stances
- Groups composed of individuals from different organisations-promote inter-organisational communication
- Scenarios generally hands on, practical demonstrations
- Scenarios selected from a catalogue of material topical in the industry
- New material regularly added to keep up to date with the modern workplace
