To understand how the UK's withdrawal might impact on EU integration, the European Parliament Committee on Constitutional Affairs has met on 11 July to present an study written by Dr Garvan Walshe, Executive Director of TRD Policy. The study focuses on five areas: the internal market; social policy; the area of freedom, security and justice; foreign, security and defence cooperation; and the Eurozone.

This decision sets out the number of representatives in each member state to be elected to the European Parliament for the 2019-2024 parliamentary term. The decision reduces and redistributes European Parliament seats following the decision by the United Kingdom to exit the European Union. The new composition will reduce the size of the European Parliament from 751 to 705 Members.
